#### Inspiration for the week

#### First Reading

#### Second Reading

Paul encourages the Thessalonians to be thankful to God and be active in their newly found faith in Christ by following his moral imperatives. How are you putting your faith into practice during this Advent?

#### Gospel Reading

John tells us that the religious leaders in Jerusalem questioned the identity of John the Baptist, wondering if he was the Messiah, Elijah, or the Prophet who Moses prophesied would come. John the Baptist responds in humility, with a clear sense of his own call. Do you humbly accept God's call in your life?

# PASTOR'S DESK

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## DEAR ST. JOHN FISHER FAMILY,

This weekend we celebrate Gaudete Sunday, which invites us to "rejoice" because of Jesus's nearness. The Psalm says *"My soul rejoices in my God!"* The ancient Israelites sang about the joy that filled their hearts when they lived the Law that the LORD had provided for them through Moses. Imagine the joy that filled the first Christians who had been given the New Commandment, the very law of Heaven that Jesus had brought to earth when he said, *"My command is this: Love one another as I have loved you"* (Jn 15:12). Yes, the first Christians had a never-ending source of joy, and it was found in love, mutual love.

They were certainly happy that God lived in their hearts and minds, but their joy wasn't motivated by external influences, not even the most sublime or divine influences. The joy they experienced was a gift that they saw blossom inside them when they loved their neighbors. St. John alludes to this when we says: *"We know that we have passed from death to life because we love our brothers"* (1 Jn 3:14). The first Christians loved one another; they loved their neighbors, and they loved their enemies. Their Roman neighbors wrote about them: *"Look! See how they love one another! Each of them is ready to die for the other"* (Tertullian, *Apologetica*, 3,7). The first Christians loved and experienced the fullness of joy, complete joy, perfect joy

(Jn 15:11); also because it made them experience unity which Jesus prayed for (Jn 17:21).

The joy of the holidays may be a little different to come by given the COVID and other difficulties, but the enduring joy we experience every time Jesus comes into our midst as we live His new commandment is the one we want to live especially now. Jesus told His disciples what the joy would be like: *"I will come back to you... and your hearts will rejoice... and no one will take away your joy"* (Jn 16:22). This is the joy we celebrate on Gaudete Sunday. It's a gift of the Risen Lord who comes back into our midst whenever we're gathered together in Him.

Let's strive for this joy that Jesus desires for us, by loving one another, loving our neighbors and loving our enemies until they love us back. What better way to celebrate Christmas than to allow Jesus to be born among us wherever we are and whenever we are together? He'll give us the fullness of joy. Like the ancient Advent hymn sang on this day: *"Gaudete! Rejoice! Rejoice! Christ is born of the Virgin Mary! Rejoice!"* And we can imitate Mary in this. We can experience a bit of her joy when she first looked upon her Son.

## QUERIDA FAMILIA DE ST. JUAN FISHER,

Este fin de semana celebramos el domingo de *Gaudete*, que nos invita a *"alegrarnos"* por la cercanía de Jesús. El Salmo dice: *"Mi espíritu se alegra en Dios, mi salvador!"* Los antiguos israelitas cantaban del gozo que llenaba sus corazones cuando vivían la Ley que el Señor les había dado por medio de Moisés. Imaginen la alegría que llenaba a los primeros cristianos a quienes se les había dado el Nuevo Mandamiento, la misma ley del Cielo que Jesús había traído a la tierra cuando dijo: *"Este es mi mandamiento: Amense los unos a los otros, como yo los he amado"* (Jn 15: 12). Sí, los primeros cristianos tenían una fuente inagotable de alegría, y la encontraban en el amor mutuo.

Ciertamente estaban felices porque Dios vivía en sus corazones y mentes, pero su alegría no estaba motivada por influencias externas, ni siquiera por las influencias más sublimes o divinas. La alegría que experimentaban fue un regalo que veían florecer en ellos cuando amaban a sus prójimos. San Juan alude a esto cuando dice: *"el amor a nuestros hermanos es para nosotros el signo de que hemos pasado de la muerte a la vida"* (1 Jn 3:14). Los primeros cristianos se amaban entre sí; amaban a sus prójimos, y amaban a sus enemigos. Los romanos decían de ellos: *"¡Mira! ¡Mira cómo se aman! Cada uno de ellos está dispuesto a morir por el otro"* (Tertuliano, *Apologetica*, 3,7). Los primeros cristianos amaron y experimentaron la plenitud de la alegría, la alegría completa, la alegría perfecta (Jn 15:11); también porque amando experimentaron la unidad por

la cual Jesús oró (Jn 17:21).

El gozo de las fiestas puede ser un poco diferente dado el COVID y otras dificultades, pero el gozo perdurable que experimentamos cada vez que Jesús viene entre nosotros mientras vivimos Su nuevo mandamiento es el que queremos vivir especialmente ahora. Jesús les dijo a Sus discípulos cómo sería este gozo: *"También ustedes ahora están tristes, pero yo los volveré a ver, y tendrán una alegría que nadie les podrá quitar"* (Jn 16:22). Esta es la alegría que celebramos en el domingo de *Gaudete*. Es un regalo del Señor Resucitado que regresa en medio nuestro cada vez que estamos reunidos en Él.

Luchemos por este gozo que Jesús desea para nosotros, amándonos unos a otros, amando a nuestros prójimos y amando a nuestros enemigos hasta que nos devuelvan el amor. ¿Qué mejor manera de celebrar la Navidad que permitir que Jesús nazca entre nosotros donde sea que estemos y cada vez que estemos juntos? Él nos dará la plenitud de la alegría. Como el antiguo himno de Adviento dice: *"Gaudete! ¡Alégrense! ¡Alégrense, Cristo nació de la Virgen María! ¡Alégrense!"* Y podemos imitar a María en esto. Podemos experimentar un poco de su alegría cuando miró por primera vez a su Hijo.
